

**REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL
OF THE CITY OF SHIVELY HELD IN THE
NEWMAN MEMORIAL BUILDING, 3920 DIXIE HIGHWAY
ON MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 17, 2007**

The meeting was called to order at 7:30 p.m. by Mayor Conner.

Opened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Ms. Burton, reported on the Shively Chili and Soup Cook-Off, which will be held on October 27, 2007 from 12:00-3:30 p.m. at the Shively Fire Department, 1800 Park Road. The deadline to enter is October 6, 2007 and prizes will be awarded. Also reported she attended Louisville Metro Mayor Jerry Abramson's Community Conversation meeting as a representative of Shively and reported several concerns from the citizens.

Ms. Mayes, thanked Fire Chief Wendell Vincent, his wife and daughter for all their help with parking when Notre Dame Academy had their cross-country meet here on August 12, 2007 in Shively Park. There were 600 kids and there was no parking left.

Mr. McDonald, reported the University of Louisville is sponsoring "Saturday Academy" which will run from September 8, 2007 to May 24, 2008 at the Duvall Education Center and is free and open to the public. If interested see me after the meeting.

Mayor Conner said John Haywood is going to give us a report.

CORRESPONDENCE:

John Haywood, Works Director reported on the drainage improvement project which many streets that have culverts have been cleaned out. On Savage Drive construction

will begin on October 1, 2007 and should finish within 60 days. On the Luken Drive field project, the contractors are about a third of the way finished and will be several more weeks to finish. Should have more information in approximately one month.

Mayor Conner asked should we send a notice to the residents on Savage Drive?

John Haywood said yes but it shouldn't cause too much disturbance for them.

John Haywood said yes because they will be working on one side of the street.

Mr. Miller said one of his neighbors has called you saying she doesn't like the white lines that are painted on the side of the road. Could we save money by not painting it?

John Haywood said it is painted that way because of a safety issue.

Mr. McDonald also said it is more visible at night.

Mr. Miller asked is this standard operating procedure to put white lines on paved streets?

John Haywood said yes it is.

Mayor Conner said streets that didn't get paved this year will not have a new white line. The white lines on those streets are just worn off.

Ms. Burton asked John Haywood if he received the pictures she brought into City Hall.

John Haywood said yes.

CITIZENS PARTICIPATION:

Ms. Carol Skyrn, 1810 Nelson Avenue expressed concerns about the wet/dry vote and hoping those establishments in Louisville Metro will be coming into Shively because we have our share right now. If they move into Shively, how do they get approved?

Mayor Conner said she too has the same concern and said they would have to apply with us and we would give the approval also.

Mr. McDonald asked Mr. Young what are the regulations and restrictions on liquor.

Mr. Kenny Young, Shively ABC Administrator said they would have to apply with the State first.

Ms. Shay Paul, 2009 Nelson Avenue complained about their new neighbors who drive a tow truck for Mosby's. This tow truck comes and goes all the time. We have called the police department and Mosby's and they got very rude with us saying he has permission to park it.

Mr. McDonald asked where does it park because we have an ordinance against that.

Ms. Paul said on the street in front of her house which takes up a lot of room. The address is 1927 Youngland Avenue.

Chief Ralph Miller said if it is a semi pulling a trailer he cannot but if it is just the semi, he can park there. The ordinance relates to tractor-trailers and not semis.

Mayor Conner asked does he park on the street?

Ms. Skyrms said yes and this is residential not commercial where he is parking. Also, there are two old vehicles that have been parked out in front of his driveway for about a year.

Mitzi Kasitz, City Clerk asked do you know the address?

Ms. Skyrms said yes its 1927 Youngland Avenue.

Mayor Conner asked do you know if these vehicles are licensed?

Ms. Skyrn said I don't think so because I've called on this before.

Chief Ralph Miller reminded everyone about the charity softball game between the Shively Sluggers and the WAMZ Hamz at 1:00 p.m., Saturday September 22, 2007. This is a fundraiser for St. Jude's Children's Hospital.

Mr. McDonald complained about the Southwest News Weekly throwing papers in driveways which is considered littering. We had this problem before with the Courier Journal throwing the orange bags in driveways. We need to pass this on to them because the Courier Journal have stopped. I'm not asking them to stop delivering them, just start putting them on porches instead.

There being no further business to come before the Council, motion by Mr. McDonald, second by Ms. Burton to adjourn the meeting.
